What are our common aspirations and challenges as we look to the future?</i></p> <p><i>The Willamette Valley, Rogue Valley and Central Oregon super-regions combine to serve as the drivers of Oregon's economy. These areas claim more than 70% of the state's residents and the bulk of the state's industry. State bureaucracies are ill-matched to meet the growth challenges that these regions represent, and an "urban-rural divide" political culture has pitted the needs of these areas against those of the rest of the state.</i></p> <p><i>What are the aspirations that the super regions hold in common for shaping future development? What are the obstacles that could prevent these super-regions from reaching shared aspirations?
